**INSTRUCTIONS TO CAMBRIDGE IGCSE AS/A2 CANDIDATES FOR OCT/NOV 2023 EXAMINATION**

- Please read this notice carefully and make sure you understand everything before the exam day. If you have any questions or doubts, please do not hesitate to ask your respective subject teacher for clarification.
  - It is mandatory to bring two documents, the Statement of Entry (SOE) and the instructions, along with your original passport, to all examinations. Failure to do so will result in denial of admission to the Examination Hall. During the exam, please place these documents on your desk for inspection.
1. **VENUE:** Boys should enter the Al-Rowad Boys section through gate 11, while girls should join the Al-Rowad Girls section through gate 15.
  2. **EXAMINATION SESSION TIMINGS: REFER TO THE TIMETABLE**  
Please check your Statement of Entry to see if your exam time is in the morning (AM) or afternoon (PM). Make sure you know the timetable well.
    - **Morning Sessions (AM):** Most morning sessions for subjects start at 11:00 AM, except for practical exams and Friday timings. The doors will close 30 minutes before the exam starting time.
    - **Afternoon Sessions (PM):** Most afternoon sessions for subjects start at 03:00 PM, and the doors will close 30 minutes before the exam starting time.
    - **Speaking Exams:** The speaking exams will take place on October 6th. The school will provide a specific time for each candidate next week.
    - **Friday Timings:** Morning session timings have been revised in the attached timetable. Afternoon sessions will start at 03:00 PM, and doors will close at 02:30 PM.
  3. **TIMETABLE CLASHES:** If you have two or more subjects scheduled at the same time, please check the notice board daily or speak to the invigilator/supervisor for instructions on how to manage this situation. However, solving this issue may be **impossible** if you have two or three exams scheduled at different **exam centers**. In such cases, kindly contact the exam officer via email.

4. **REGULATIONS**



- Make Sure You Know the Rules
- You must follow all instructions given by Cambridge.
- You must check your hall and seat number before each examination.
- You must be on time for all examinations. You are expected to be present **ONE** hour before the scheduled starting time of your examination. **The doors will be closed 30 minutes before the start of your examination.**
- You may take into the examination room only the materials and equipment which are allowed. You **must not** take into the examination room calculator cases or instruction leaflets, bags, pencil cases, personal TVs/stereos, pagers, **mobile phones**, palm-top computers, or any other material or equipment. **Anyone found in possession of any unauthorized material, even if you do not intend to use it, will automatically disqualify you from the subject being taken and must be reported to the Exams Board.**
- **Please note that** the school is not responsible for handbags and valuables left outside the Examination Hall. **Please make it a point not to bring such things with you.**
- You must not participate in unfair practices when preparing coursework or taking the examination.
- Correcting fluid/correcting pens **must not be used.**
- You must not talk, communicate with, seek assistance from, give help to, or disturb other candidates once the examination has started.
- Smoking is entirely and strictly prohibited in any part of the exam venue facility.

## 5. INFORMATION

- **KNOW YOUR EXAMINATION SCHEDULE:** Make sure you know the dates and times of your examinations.
- **ARRIVE EARLY:** Arrive at least **ONE HOUR** before the start of each examination. If you arrive late for an examination, report to the invigilator running the examination. If you arrive after the Key Time, you cannot take the exams.
- **STAY IN THE ROOM:** Do not leave the room until you are permitted to do so.
- **ATTEND ALL EXAMINATIONS:** If you miss an examination without an acceptable reason (with evidence), you will not usually be given a grade in the subject.
- **BRING NECESSARY ITEMS:** Leave anything you do not need or are not allowed outside the examination room. Take into the examination room the pens, pencils, rubbers, and any



instruments that you need for the examination. You may not borrow anything from another candidate during the examination.

- Note: You must write in blue or black ink, except for multiple-choice papers completed by pencil (B or HB). Colored pencils or inks may be used only for diagrams, maps, charts, etc. Highlighter pens or glue must not be used unless explicitly permitted by the syllabus.

## 6. CALCULATORS, DICTIONARIES, AND SPELL-CHECKERS

- You may use a calculator if it's permitted for the subject. The only allowed calculators are Casio 991 ES and Casio 991 ES PLUS
- Please be informed that you cannot use **Cg 50 calculators** for the examinations. All the calculators should be put on examination mode.
- If you use a calculator, ensure the battery and its function.
  - clear anything stored, and do not bring operating instructions or prepared programs into the examination room.
- You must not use a dictionary or computer spell-checker unless you are told that you may do so.

## 7. EXAMINATION INSTRUCTIONS

- Listen to the invigilator and do what you are asked to do.
- Tell the Invigilator at once,
  - if you think you have not been given the correct question paper or all the materials listed on the front of the paper,
  - if the question paper is incomplete or poorly printed.
- Read carefully the instructions on the question paper and the answer book/answer paper. Do what they ask you to do.
- Fill in the details required on the front of your question paper and answer book/answer paper before the start of the examination.
- Do your rough work on the proper examination stationery. Cross it through and leave it on your desk when you leave.

## 8. ADVICE AND ASSISTANCE

- If you feel your work may be affected by ill health or any other reason on the examination day, tell the Invigilator.
- If you have a problem during the examination and are in doubt about what you should do, you feel ill or need more answer papers, raise your hand to attract attention. The Invigilator will



come to you and answer your question.

- You may not ask for any explanation of the questions and will not be given.

## 9. LEAVING THE EXAMINATION ROOM

- No candidate will be allowed to leave before the end of the examination session.
- If you have used more than one answer book and lost sheets of the answer paper, you must place them in the correct order.
- Fasten them together before you leave.
- **You must not leave the examination room until the invigilator tells you to do so.**
- When you leave the examination room, you must leave behind the question paper, your answer book/answer paper, rough work, and any other (used or unused) materials provided for the examination.

## 10. WHAT CAN I DO TO BE ACADEMICALLY HONEST?

- Make sure you understand all the instructions given to you. Ask your teacher if you are not sure.
- Learn how to reference your work correctly. Include references for all sources you have used, not just books but also internet sites, images, etc.
- If you work within a group, make sure your contribution is your work, using your ideas.
- Acknowledge the work of others.
- Allow enough time to finish your work so you are not tempted to rush and leave out references.

## 11. WARNING

- Cheating, using unfair practices, or breaking the rules during your examinations may result in **disqualification from all of your subjects.**

## 12. EXAMINATION RESULTS

- Online Provisional Cambridge International IGCSE, AS & A Level examination results will be available online in mid-January 2024.
- Statements of results will be available by the end of January 2024.
- Certificates are expected to be received from Cambridge by the end of March 2024.
- It is essential to collect your certificates within 12 months of the issue of the original date. After this period, **the certificate will be returned to Cambridge.**
