B. Project Based Assessments (PBA)

- PBA is an opportunity to utilize and measure the higher order thinking skills of students.
- Project-based assessment will apply multi-faceted skills to be encompassed into a cumulative project.
- PBA allows 21st-century skills, such as collaboration, creative and critical thinking, skills to be addressed.
- Students will be assessed through the following phases:
 - Phase 1 Starting a Project with Students (Project Planning)
 - Phase 2 Developing & working on the Project (Research and Analysis)
 - Phase 3 Ending the project (Creation and Presentation)

C. Mandatory Semester Assessment (MSA)

- Grades 4-9 (PBA and Non-PBA Subjects)
 - o Students must complete **<u>2 Mandatory Quizzes per Semester</u>** for each subject;
 - To qualify for the *best mark out of the 2 quizzes,* a student must complete *both quizzes* during the semester.
- Grades 10-12 (PBA Subjects)
 - Students must complete **<u>2 Mandatory Quizzes per Semester</u>** for each subject;
 - To qualify for the **best mark out of the 2 quizzes**, a student must complete **both quizzes** during the semester.

Updated AIS Subject and Grade Levels Assessment Breakdown (2023-2024)

- Grades 10-12 (Non-PBA Subjects)
 - Student must complete <u>3 Mandatory Quizzes per Semester</u> for each subject. The <u>first two quizzes</u> must be completed <u>by mid-semester</u>, and the <u>third quiz</u> must be completed before the end of the semester.
 - To qualify for the *best mark out of the 3 quizzes,* a student must complete *all 3 quizzes* during the semester.
 - In order to ensure that every student has the opportunity to improve their academic performance, all students have the option to retake quizzes in <u>Mid-Semester 1, 2, and 3 for all subjects.</u>
- The duration of the quizzes should be <u>20 25 minutes only</u>.

D. Formative Continuous Assessment (FCA)

- A minimum of *4 FCAs* will be given per Semester for each subject. At least one of these *FCAs* will be completed online (*i.e., Schoology*);
- A variety of *formative assessment* questions will be used to assess students' understanding (*i.e., MCQs, T/F, MTC, Short* Answer, Essay Questions., Ordering, etc.);

E. Homework

- 1 homework per week will be given.
- Homework will not be marked as pass or fail. Our teachers will continuously provide effective feedback to reinforce teaching and learning.
- The <u>Homework Rubric Grading Guide</u> to mark students' work.

F. Classwork

- Recorded daily by the subject teacher and includes books/materials brought to class, participation, etc.
- Classwork will not be marked as pass or fail.
- The <u>Classwork Rubric Grading Guide</u> to mark students' work.

G. Final Exams

- The <u>End of Semester Exams</u> will have a duration of 1 hour to 2-hour period (depending on the subject/grade);
- The content of the exams will be aligned with the <u>List of Material Covered and Syllabus Outlines</u>, including but not limited to, key concepts, principles, and theories;
- The examinations may include <u>multiple-choice questions, short answer questions, and essay questions</u> to assess students' knowledge, critical thinking skills, and analytical abilities.

H. Procedures for deducting marks from students

- Classwork/homework marks will not be deducted if the student provides a valid reason for being absent.
- If a student fails to submit a classwork/homework within the given timeframe, <u>the parent(s) and Deputy Principal must</u> <u>be informed before deducting any marks from the student.</u>
- If a child fails any subject area (i.e., a quiz, project, or any other forms of CA), the parent(s) should be notified prior to receiving a report card.
- If a student has an unexcused absence and does not provide a valid document(s) to make up the missing *guarter's CA*,
 <u>Quizzes, and Final Examinations</u> within the given timeframe, the overall mark will be recorded as 0% (zero).
